Lisbon Treaty

- Confirmed relevance of objectives of Treaty of Rome setting up the CAP
- Recognised broader and more complex challenges – economic, social, environmental
- Set down new obligations
 - environment and public health
 - territorial cohesion
 - co-operation with other policies



Parliament/Council: "droit de regard" on each draft measure proposed by Commission pursuant to a Union act, at any time during the procedure, but the Commission does not have to wait to adopt the measure.








The path of CAP expenditure 1980-2020

Outlook 2050 FAO/OECD


- Agricultural production needs to increase by 60%
- Additional 1billion tonnes cereals and 200mt meat needed
- Projected land area to increase by 69 Mha (<5%)
- Need for more sustainable production 25% of all agricultural land degraded
- Need for better agronomic practices, strengthening innovation systems, addressing needs of smallholders




The EU in the 2050 outlook: Production

Past and projected percentage changes in agricultural production




Percentage share of EU in global agricultural production



^{*} EU-15 for historical period, EU-27 for projection.



GLOBAL AREA OF BIOTECH CROPS Million Hectares (1996-2011)



A record 16.7 million farmers, in 29 countries, planted 160 million hectares (395 million acres) in 2011, a sustained increase of 8% or 12 million hectares (30 million acres) over 2010.

EU Crop/Feed Production

EU produces 150 million tonnes of feed for

- 87 million cows
- 151 million pigs
- 450 million chickens
- 40 million tonnes raw soya products imported into EU of which 20 mt is used in animal feed
- Arable land farmed in EU is about 105 Mha
- Crops imported into EU were grown on 35 Mha
